Hours for the clinic are 11 am – 2 pm.

The MRC is hopeful that this will be the first of additional monthly mobile clinics. Services will be focused on primary care. The MRC will work to find help for medical needs outside of the clinic's abilities. Practitioners are unable to prescribe controlled substances.
