Youth are Educating The City of Callaway About Tobacco Retail Licensing New law would aid in enforcement of tobacco laws

**Panama City, Fla.** – The Bay County chapter of Students Working Against Tobacco (SWAT)—together with the Bay County Tobacco Free Partnership---will be educating their community leaders on the benefits of Tobacco Retail Licenses (TRL) to the City of Callaway Commission at the end of the month. These young leaders from around Bay County will share with the Commission the community-wide benefits of a TRL, which would empower the local government with better control over where tobacco can be sold and what kinds of businesses can sell tobacco products. Should the TRL be adopted by the Commission, it would aid in tobacco product placement enforcement and help ensure responsible retailing in the City of Callaway.

SWAT students hope that this license will help protect Bay County's young people from dangerous tobacco products at the point-of-sale level, all the while taking a continued stance against Big Tobacco's youth-focused target marketing. The commission meeting will take place on June 26, 2018 at 6:00 PM at the Callaway Arts & Conference Center.
